In my opinion, Tony is a prophetic trail-blazer, particularly as a white, male Brit and church leader. His book is one to trawl through and bring in a catch slowly, facing the pain in God's heart and human beings' hearts with a glistening sense of biblical hope for a better future. Can the mould be broken of heaps of homogeneous churches here in Britain? I am hopeful it can.
