NOAH Enterprise

We create pathways out of poverty and destitution for some of the most excluded and disadvantaged people in the community. The ultimate goal is to see people living independent lives where they can fulfil their potential. Where we see an individual or a group of people with a problem we look to develop a solution.

Our Outreach Teams target rough sleepers, street drinkers, help ex-rough sleepers sustain their housing and support migrants, refugees and asylum seekers and people without a home to go to as they leave hospital. For those they meet on the streets they persuade them to engage with our services and then work with them to start to rebuild their lives. In our Housing First project the focus is supporting the most vulnerable rough sleepers in Luton to secure and maintain a tenancy whilst addressing other issues in their lives. Our project working with migrants is also able to help individuals who desire to get a job or return home through our reconnections service. Many have had their ID stolen or taken away from them and we can assist in getting copies of their ID to assist them to start to rebuild their lives. We also offer immigration advice and support asylum seekers to settle so they can work in the UK.

NOAH Enterprise works throughout Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire helping homeless people and those in the community who are most disadvantaged. Individuals and families who have somehow escaped the net of services intended to support them.



Welfare Centre



Our Welfare Centre offers hot meals, showers, laundry, housing advice, resettlement and companionship. We provide a range of healthcare including a GP surgery, Mental Health Clinic and a mobile Dentistry. We provide a range of recreational activities at the Centre including drama, music and art workshops as well as ESOL and cookery classes. In the current Cost of Living Crisis we also have food parcels available for those most in need.

NOAH's Fresh Opportunities Service offers a range of training for people to provide key skills and to rebuild their confidence with the aim of helping them progress towards further training or employment. We are particularly successful with those who struggle to engage in mainstream training. Our range of training includes IT, employability, returning to work and training for women.

Training is combined with work experience in a range of employable skills in our NOAH Shops as well as at the welfare centre and in other partner organisations.

NOAH is a Christian values based charity that relies on a lot of public support. If anyone would like to get involved or simply support our work, we would love to hear from you. Volunteers are needed to help in our kitchens. We also need volunteers to help in our shops in Hitchin, Knebworth, Hightown and Lewsey Farm either front of the shop selling to customers or behind the scenes helping to sort clothing.
